

## WASTEWATER PLANT BOARD REPORT

AUGUST 2018

**DAILY OPERATIONS:** Collect water samples from influent and effluent flow and analyze PH levels, chlorine levels, temperatures and suspended solids. Collect and analyze activated sludge samples under microscope and settleometer test for evaluations for process control. Inspect and record the hours for blowers for aeration system and influent pump lift station. Aerator rake cleaned and buckets of solids from rake removed to dumped and replaced when needed. Bar screen inspected from overnight operation and tray cleaned of debris and barrels of solids dumped and cleaned before replaced. Clarifier checked and core samples taken from activated sludge blanket and calculated volume and depth for process control. Lift station inspected and hours recorded and electrodes cleaned when needed.

**WEEKLY OPERATION:** Clarifier brushed and chlorinate weir plates, scum trough cleaned and scum pit pumped. Brush down Parshell flume and effluent tank walls, check chlorine levels in tanks and order when needed. Hosed down bar screen building floors&walls upstairs and down, grease bearings check oil levels and keep grit from screen. Operate gritwasher dispose in dumpster and clean backhoe bucket of solids when finished. Set up samplers for 24 hr composite sampling then collected and prepared for outside analysis of BOD, TSS and fical coliform levels reported to EPA and DEC.

**PLANT OPERATION:** Samples of grit and solids tested and report completed and sent for Seneca Meadows Landfill for approval.

Mike Kardash has completed courses at State University at Morrisville and will eligible to take State exam in March of 2019.

D.E.C.'s request for information report due in October 2019, is 90% complete and the outside lab has been contacted about the extra sampling and sampling containers should arrive soon.

Built new shelf in digester #1 to hang buckets of debris from aerator rake so they can drain before disposal in dumpster.

Ordered a new 2in trash pump from Northern Tool & Equip. to pump out clarifiers and digesters.

Remove and replace lovejoy couplings on R.A.S. pumps

Mowed lawns and weed eat grounds outside and inside fence line and around the bathroom building.

Repaired crack in the wall on distribution box removed crumbling concrete and replace with fast dryin hydraulic cement.

Weed trimmer repaired, recoil had to be replaced and oil changed on lawn mower and deck removed and inspected. Belts kept braking

Changed oil on the plants pick-up truck, had problems with filter removal but we prevailed.

I would also like to thank board member Gene Colorito for the help at the plant while assit. operator Mike Kardash was at Morrsville .

For the month of August we treated and avg. of 278,000 gallons a day, and recieved a little over 5 inches of rain for the month.
